Attached, please find a signed Petition requesting that the Township of Esquimalt consider and address these concerns when planning and completing the proposed Phase 2 project.

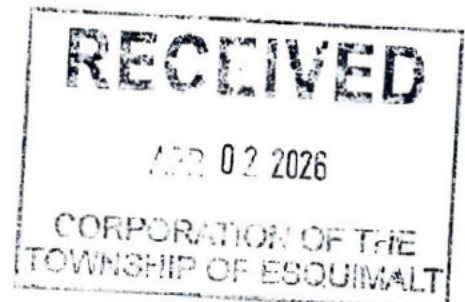
