Dear Resident,

### Re: Proposed Summer Truck Traffic Route

Harbour Resource Partners (HRP), the contractor building the McLoughlin Point Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), has developed a Traffic Management Plan to ensure that all Project traffic follows designated traffic routes. The Traffic Management Plan, including the current traffic route, was approved by the Township of Esquimalt in May 2017. Construction of the WWTP started in June 2017.

On behalf of the Esquimalt Liaison Committee, the Wastewater Treatment Project Team, in conjunction with the Township of Esquimalt and HRP, is reviewing the option of an alternate traffic route during the summer school months. If approved the alternate route would be used in July and August of 2018, 2019 and 2020.

Community residents along the current and proposed alternative routes are being asked to provide their feedback. Next steps include:

- compiling feedback from residents;
- providing a submission to the Township of Esquimalt Community Safety Working Group for their input; and
- presenting to Esquimalt Council for a decision regarding the proposed alternate summer traffic route.

03/13/18	<p>I am concerned about the idea of using Lyall/Lampson as a summer route for transporting material. This is a busy road with all the street parking.</p>
03/15/18	<p>Hello,</p> <p>My name is XXX and I live along the proposed summer route for the delivery trucks for the wastewater treatment plant. I strongly disagree with this as there is enough traffic as is with the military personnel, buses &amp; some heavy trucks already going by our house. We live on Lyall St. close to the Macaulay school. And it doesn't mean that the school is on a break that there are no kids around! There are children playing at the school playgrounds daily even through summer months. So please, keep the route as it is and don't go by the Macaulay School.</p> <p>Also our house was build in a year of 1950 and the foundation is not that great so heavy trucks will damage our house and cause cracks in our walls etc.</p> <p>Thank you for listening.</p>

03/21/18	<p>I am not in favour of the proposed summer route.</p> <p>Respectfully,</p>
03/22/18	<p>Hi, thank you so much for providing the handout on the wastewater treatment project. I feel very strongly that having the trucks drive down Lampson to Lyall Street is a horrible mistake.</p> <p>That section of Lampson is incredibly busy at the best of times - cars coming and going from Naden travel down Lyall to Lampson, turn left and proceed up Lampson. There is always a backlog of traffic at the four way stop at Lyall and Lampson, as well as at Lampson and Esquimalt (both heading towards the waterfront and towards Craigflower Road.</p> <p>Because I try to spend a little time working on my yard most days, I am witness to many near miss cyclist/vehicle accidents due to the amount of traffic, plus there are many residents who park on the even numbered side of Lampson Street.</p> <p>During the summer, many daycare operations walk their children to Macaulay School to use the playground. These little ones are all walking along, hand in hand, from the rec centre and private daycares in the neighbourhood. They travel down Lyall Street, through the four way stop and the school yard is constantly in use.</p> <p>I think this plan is a big mistake and will create chaos for pedestrians, cyclists, drivers and residents. Please choose a different route. Even Macaulay Street would be a better choice as it is not very active, there wouldn't be school traffic, the trucks would bypass Macaulay School playgrounds and fields, and there is a no left turn from Esquimalt Road onto Macaulay, further alleviating the amount of traffic.</p> <p>This is not a case of "not in my backyard" but rather a plea for a safe, albeit already overly busy, stretch of road.</p> <p>Thank you,</p> <p>Proud to be an Esquimalt resident!</p>

	<p>I am a resident XXX Lampson St, between Lyall St and Esquimalt Rd. I would like to both ask a question and provide feedback on the proposed summer traffic route for the McLoughlin Point Wastewater Treatment Plant.</p> <p>First, the question- why does there have to be a different route for summer? If the thought is that school is not in session during the summer and no children are around, this is not correct. Children use the school fields and play area during the summer months as well.</p> <p>I am opposed to the summer route running up Lampson St, as it is higher density of single family dwellings and Lampson St already has heavy truck traffic during the daytime, including large semi-trucks taking products to stores like the Country Grocer and similar at Esquimalt Plaza.</p> <p>If there was to be a truck coming from the treatment plant on Lampson St and another truck coming the other way on Lampson St, they would not be able to pass each other on the road, at the same time.</p> <p>This summer route is not a good idea. Why not use the same route at all times.</p>
