Parks and Recreation

2) 21-463 Esquimalt Gorge Park Pavilion Multi-Purpose Partitions and Nature House Power Servicing Requirements, Staff Report No. P&R-21-006

Director of Parks and Recreation Services responded to questions from Council.

Moved by Councillor Hundleby, seconded by Councillor Vermeulen: That Council approve \$250,000 in additional funds for the Esquimalt Gorge Park Pavilion budget to be reallocated from the 2021 Oil and Grit Separator Project (2021 Capital Reserves Account) to fund the purchase and installation of multi-purpose room partitions and Nature House power service. Carried Unanimously.

Carried Unanimously.
