






Deployable Strength

2025 Budget Overview

- Cost drivers: Wages, E-Comm 9-1-1 Levy,
 contractual/mandatory increases, new staffing resources
- Contractual and mandatory costs: 97% of the total budget



What Citizens Say

"While they are doing the best with the tools and resources they have been given, it is simply not enough to make this City a safe place to live and work in."

"I do not believe the police can do any more than they are at the moment with the resources and people they have."

"It's a thankless job and I think VicPD does a great one. I wish the force had more support and resources..."

Aside from the situation downtown - which is out of control - VicPD is doing great. I feel that VicPD needs extra funding and resources to be able to contain the situation downtown. I don't think that the situation there is reflective of the work VicPD is doing, I think the police simply has too few resources to be able to address the level of drug crime, homelessness, and violence the drug epidemic has brought."

Key Messages

- □ VicPD is understaffed for current and future needs
- □ VicPD is using Reserve funds to operate
- High public demand continues
- □ Our budget aligns with Esquimalt Council priorities

In Summary

The Police Board supports the 2025 provisional budget presented to the council.

Cutting \$2.085M from the budget does not align with what citizens and businesses want.

Continued under-funding of police services is not sustainable.

The requested budget reduction will decrease safety in the communities that we serve.
