Hi Anja, please add us to upcoming Council meeting re increasing fence heights for backyards.

Chris and I have been property owners in Esquimalt for 18 years. We concur with the other residents re increasing fence height - we would like to request that it be raised from 7-9 feet. Over the course of 18 years we have had deer jump our existing 6 foot backyard fence and consume our plants in the backyard. We always beautify our property for our community's enjoyment but are finding it more difficult and costly to maintain this. We would like to repair our existing fence but would like to better understand whether council will be increasing the fence height prior to incurring a substantial bill. Please advise.
