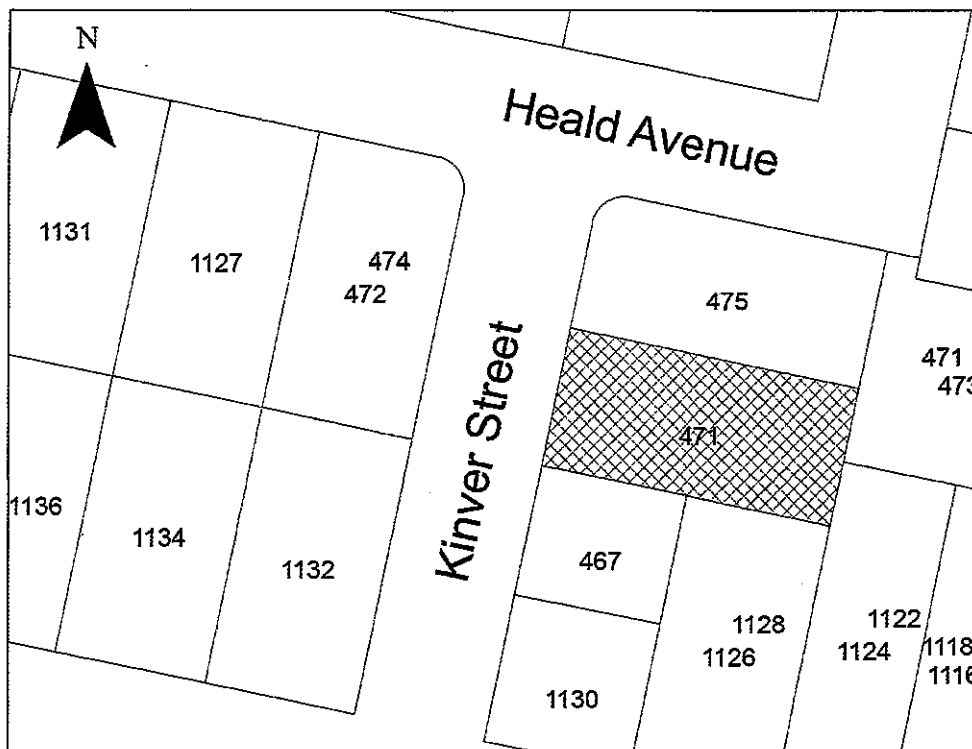
NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Homeless protest returns to courthouse

Members of Nuu-chai-nulth Nation homeless and housing protest spent the night camped on the grounds of Victoria Law Courts ahead of their court appearance Wednesday.

The appearance is for 10 campers, including leader Chrissy Brett, who were arrested Oct. 20 on charges of mischief for taking their rising camp onto the grounds of Woodwynn Farm, owned and managed by the Provincial Rental Housing Corporation. The campers removed girders

at the agricultural property located at 779 West Saanich Road on Oct. 19, drove vehicles onto the property and estab-

lished an encampment.

"BC Housing has failed to provide homeless people with adequate, permanent and safe housing options, which [is] why we chose to occupy this site to house people who need a place to stay," said Brett. "People need to belong somewhere."

Police say they spoke with representatives from BC Housing at the time who instructed them to remove the individuals after repeated attempts to have the group voluntarily leave the property were unsuccessful.

The campers were released on conditions that they do not return to the property.

Climate change centre

One of the world's leading oceanographers says the creation of a new ocean and climate research centre at the University of Victoria will create intellectual and economic spin-offs.

"Where disciplines interact, innovation explodes," said Kate Moran, president and chief executive officer of Ocean Networks Canada (ONC).

It monitors the west and east coasts of Canada and the Arctic to deliver at no charge real-time data scientific research to other scientists, communities, governments and industry through two large ocean-based observatories among other facilities. By way of example, its

monitoring of sea-surface currents informs maritime navigation and emergency responses that range from distressed ships to oil spills, while its acoustic data measuring underwater noise helps authorities protect marine mammals such as killer whales from underwater noise.

Overall, it manages 400 instruments containing over 5,500 sensors.

But ONC is not just a clearing house for data, but also a technological incubator, as it is currently developing Canada's first early warning system for earthquakes, among other items for public and private uses.

Officials from the network, the university, as well as senior spheres of government cited this history during the official opening of

the network's new Ok on Arbutus Street, just Victoria's main campus.
