The Victoria Shakespeare Society is a society who delivers the Greater Victoria Shakespeare Festival (GVSF) including "Bard Across the Bridge" situated in Esquimalt and the education series. The society has a board that meets all requirements under the BC Societies Act and the festival has been operational since 1991. There is a small staff that meet the operational needs.

5. What is your organization's history of providing benefit to the residents of Esquimalt?

Since 2017,GVSF has extended production and made it mobile to Esquimalt. GVSF is free to everyone 12 and under and to anyone for whom cost is a barrier. In 2024 hundreds saw our production at Lampson School with an increase in youth attendance and free tickets to residents. 2024 Esquimalt initiatives include: a fundraising performance at the Saxe Point Pub and performing at Esquimalt Storyfest.

6. What is your organization's role or niche in the community? What makes it different from other similar organizations?

Local actors and young actors work with professional mentor actors to create theatre that has been highly reviewed and enjoyed by thousands each season. Educational offerings continue throughout the year appealing to both youth and adults.

7. How is your organization moving towards financial self-sufficiency?

GVSF has been in operation since 1991. While mostly self sufficient, the costs of mobilizing the production for Bard Across the Bridge are not yet offset by ticket sales. We will continue building the Esquimalt audience through increased presence.

-GVSF aims to bring Shakespeare performances and education to all - with quality and accessibility as it's focus ensuring that 12 and under are always free and that cost not be a barrier for anyone to attend.

-The 2025 season will bring Romeo and Juliet to the stage in June/July. Bard Across the Bridge will focus many of these dates in an Esquimalt park.

-The education series including the podcast and close works projects are free to all and available year round ensuring classic works are easily enjoyed by all ages.

-The focus for 2025 is to continue to build our audience in Esquimalt and across Victoria to increase ticket sales and revenue.

-The goal for 2026 and beyond is to return to a two show festival as it was pre-COVID.

9. How will your organization measure whether the program or event was a success?

GVSF would like to see audience attendance in Esquimalt grow by 10% in 2025.

10. What is the minimum level of funding required for the program, project or event to occur? What would be the impacts if you received less than your full request?

We are requesting \$6,855 which is 6.4% of the preliminary 2025 budget. If we recieve less, we'd have to reconsidre the festival's ability to mobilize to Esquimalt in 2026 and onwards.

Grants that were previously given to Arts groups to support recovery from COVID have ended.

Grants have been acquired from CRD and BC Gaming.

Continued fundraising and seeking sponsorship. The GVSF wishes to avoid raising ticket prices and commits to continued accessibility.

In 2024 over a thousand people attended the festival. Similar numbers engaged in our education series. 50% of performances took place in Esquimalt but data is not available for residence.

18. What environmental and sustainability initiatives will form part of the planning and execution of your program or event?

The GVSF and it's cast, crew and volunteers are committed to ensuring that their live theatre production leaves no trace. The production mobilizes fully and the site is unharmed and clean.

19. How many volunteer staff do you utilize and what are the total volunteer hours?

The festival runs best on 3 volunteers per performance. The actors and crew are paid. There were more than 300 volunteer hours last year.

20. Could the program, project or event occur without volunteer support? Why or why not?

Volunteers act as ushers and guides for people at the event itself. While we have paid staff, the volunteers increase the ease in which people find their seats and find their way around the festival.

21. Please describe any significant established partnerships with other community groups

Esquimalt's TCAC encouraged GVSF to expand to Esquimalt in 2017 as "Bard Across the Bridge." They provide no financial support. In years past they have provided some of the volunteers.

GVSF would publicly acknowledge the grant in all media, posters and in the front of house speech. There will be a return to a paper program this year and it will include mention of the grant.

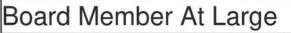
