Moved by Councillor Liberchuk, seconded by Councillor Morrison: That Council, upon considering the comments made at the Public Hearing, resolves that Amendment Bylaw No. 2858, attached as Schedule 'A' to Staff Report DEV-15-051, which would amend Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050 by changing the zoning designation of PID 004-671-961 Lot A, Section 10, Esquimalt District, Plan 12881 [865/867 Kindersley Road] shown cross hatched on Schedule 'A' of Bylaw No. 2858, from RD-1 [Two Family Residential] to CD No. 94 [Comprehensive Development District No. 94], be read a third time and adopted. Carried Unanimously.

Muriel Dunn, resident, expressed concerns regarding the hedge at Lampson Street and Head Street. The signage is hidden, due to overgrown foliage which reduces sightlines and creates an unsightly area.

Karen James, resident, expressed concerns and opposition to Development Variance Permit (DVP) Application for 8- 300 Plaskett Place being approved.

Jane Frindt, resident, expressed concerns of depreciation of property value, if DVP00037 Application for 8- 300 Plaskett Place was approved.

Gary Brennan, resident, expressed privacy, social and structural concerns and opposition to DVP00037 Application for 8- 300 Plaskett Place being approved, as water view sightlines would be disrupted for Strata residents.

Teodora Kristof, resident, expressed concerns regarding traffic flow on Admirals Road, between Fraser Street and Lyall Street and suggested restricting parking to one side of the road only. She also requested that Council approve DVP00037 Application for 8- 300 Plaskett Place, Re: Deck.

Mark Eraut, Owner Bingo Esquimalt, encouraged Council to support Esquimalt hosting a Community Casino, due to the community benefits.

Bill Rowe, resident, expressed concerns Re: Development Variance Permit (DVP) Application process for 8- 300 Plaskett Place and opposition to application being approved.

9. STAFF REPORTS

Finance

1) <u>15-461</u> Local Grant - Esquimalt High School Athletics Program, Staff Report FIN-15-018

Director of Finance advised the applicant was in attendance.

Mike Thompson, teacher, and 4 students addressed Council, provided an overview of Local Grant application for Esquimalt High School Athletics Program and responded to questions from Council.

Director of Community Safety Services clarified liability, public education and weed concerns and responded to questions from Council.

Council suggested educating residents regarding the use of pesticides to elimate weeds on the boulevard and negative affect on Storm Water Management, including Gorge Waterway.

Moved by Councillor Low, seconded by Councillor Hundleby: That Council give first, second and third readings to the Boulevard Maintenance Bylaw, 2015, No. 2860. Carried Unanimously.

Development Services

4) <u>15-465</u> Development Varience Permit No. DVP00037, 8-300 Plaskett Place, Staff Report DEV-15-052

Director of Development Services advised, Building Schemes are enforced by the Strata and not Municipality and responded to questions to Council. Director of Community Safety services responded to questions from Council.

This will be the last year for the Hockey Academy due to lack of attendance. The school recently received a \$4000 Farm to School Grant, bringing local food to school by developing a Community Garden. Council suggested the Student Council attend a Council meeting and address Council.
