I attended the open house with regard to the changes proposed for the church of St Peter and St Paul. I must give credit to the people involved in the Heritage Advisory Panel for the work they have done but I still fail to see why it is necessary to alter a heritage structure that has remained unaltered for over one hundred and fifty years. The proposal they are recommending requires removing part of a stain glass window, opening up the wall for a doorway and adding a very big porch to the south side. All this effort is apparently so people won't have to walk outside to the adjacent building to use the washroom. I feel this building has significant heritage importance for the Township of Esquimalt. It predates Confederation and was part of the Naval base that protected the new British Colony from invasion. I feel to alter this building in any way would be a travesty to the history of this country.
