
# Cost Drivers (and opportunities) for the 2020 Budget

#### **Cost Drivers**

- Increments in the collective agreements
- Full year costs for the 6 additional officers approved in 2019
- Employers' Health Tax
- Maintenance of capital reserves
- Retirements
- Contracted services to outside agencies (CREST, E-Comm, PRIME etc)

#### **Cost Reduction Opportunities**

- Recruitments at lower wage levels (savings)
- Greater integration with other police departments




# 2019 Budget Overview


The following represents the 2019 Police budget approved by both councils and does not include items in the 2019 Provisional Budget that were not approved.

#### 2019 Operating Expenditures Budget


#### Operating Expenditures by Services
