1. CALL TO ORDER

1) <u>17-140</u> 2017 Tax Rate - Discussion, Ian Irvine, Director of Financial Services and Information Technology

Director of Financial services presented a PowerPoint Presentation, provided three scenarios for the proposed 2017 Municipal Tax Rate increase and responded to questions from Council.

Director of Engineering responded to questions from Council.

Moved by Councillor Low, seconded by Councillor Burton-Krahn: That Council gives budget approval for Projects 1, 2, 3 and 4 in the amount of \$159,000 in the 2017-2021 Financial Plan, as set out in Staff Report EPW-17-008. Carried Unanimously.

5) 17-132 Rezoning Application, 455 Nelson Street, PID: 003-378-748, Lot A, Suburban Lot 49, Esquimalt District, Plan 22014, Staff Report DEV-17-020

Director of Development Services responded to guestions from Council.
