**Reconciliation:** The Journey of Our Generations tells a story of the first 145 years of Canada's history and into the era of reconciliation; its highs and lows, the emotions it stirs up and its unimaginable gifts. Each is committed to creating a new journey for generations to come. Each is a professional in their field.

This workshop generates changes in understanding for individuals at multiple levels.

- Move beyond fear and discomfort to a place of desire to "do things differently" and take action toward reconciliation.
- Elders represent the hard experiences of their past and yet model true forgiveness so that participants witness true forgiveness in action.
- Knowledge and understanding of how indigenous traditional knowledge and world view hold solutions for many broader issues –climate change, use and availability of water
- This workshop creates a safe space for coming together and healing together
