An application for a change in Official Community Plan Land Use Designation and Zoning has been received from the registered owner of 520 Constance Avenue.

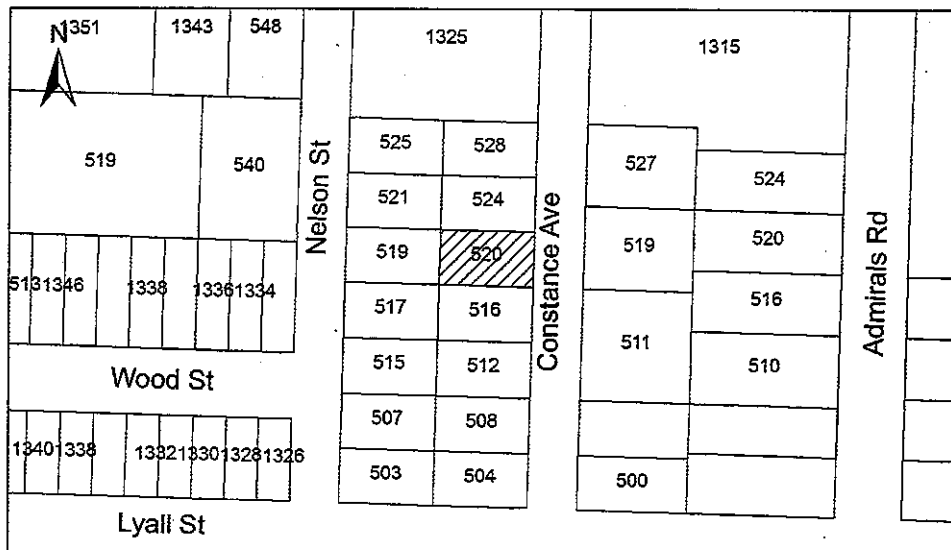
Purpose of the Application:

Official Community Plan Bylaw, 2006, No. 2646, Amendment Bylaw No. 2918 provides for a change in land use designation of 520 Constance Avenue [legal description below] shown hatched on the map below from Institutional to Townhouse Residential and adds this property to the 'Development Permit Area. No.1 – Multi-Unit Residential' development permit area; and

Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050, Amendment Bylaw No. 2919 provides for a change in the zoning designation of 520 Constance Avenue [legal description below] shown hatched on the map below, from 'Institutional Day Use [P-4]' to 'Multiple Family Residential [RM-1]', and would also remove the 'Institutional Day Use [P-4]' zoning designation from Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050.

The general purpose of these bylaws is to facilitate redevelopment of the subject property for possible future residential uses.

Dinosaurs take centre stage at the Royal

May 2 at the Royal features

Be transported back to a time when dinosaurs roamed the deserts of North Africa, with National Geographic Live's *Spinosaurus, Lost Giant of the Cretaceous*, coming to the Royal Theatre on May 2.

This special evening and final event in the NatGeo Live series features German/Moroccan paleontologist Nizar Ibrahim, who will tell tales of his search for some of the biggest dinosaurs to ever walk the Earth, and his discovery of what is believed to be the first truly semiaquatic dinosaur, *Spinosaurus aegyptiacus*.

A post-doctoral scholar in vertebrate anatomy and paleontology at the University of Chicago, Ibrahim was the National Geographic Emerging Explorer in 2014 and the following year was named a TED Fellow, the first paleontologist in the history of the program.

He was part of an international team of scientists who scoured the deserts of Morocco and beyond, looking for clues to life in the Cretaceous period.

Along with many huge dinosaur bones, he has discovered fossil footprints and a new species of flying reptile with an 18-foot wingspan believed to have lived 95 million years ago.

His findings can be found in the journal *Science* and as a cover story for *National Geographic* magazine.

An upcoming paper describing the ecosystem of what is now Morocco's Sahara Desert in the mid-Cretaceous period is predicted to be a milestone, providing the most detailed account of the diversity, paleoecology and geologic context of fossil vertebrates from North Africa.

Khalsa Day includes parade, festivities

For the first time ever, Victoria will celebrate the Sikh holiday, Khalsa Day, with a parade and festivities planned for April 29.

In celebration of Vaisakhi, the annual holiday celebrated by both Sikhs and Hindus, this year's celebration honours the Guru Granth, the spiritual canon and Guru of the Sikhs, and Guru Panth, the physical embodiment of the Guru within the Sikh community.

Vaisakhi recognizes the day on which the tenth Guru, Guru Gobind Singh, in 1699 created the order of the Khalsa, the collective of committed Sikhs, both male and female, who are the leaders and defenders of the Sikh way.

Organized by Gurdwara Singh Sabha of Victoria, the religious parade will include hymn singing, martial-arts displays and langar, the distribution of food from the free kitchen.

Langar is a form of selfless ser-

vice called seva, the belief that food should be made available to all visitors regardless of race, religion or social status. It follows three Sikh principles of fighting hunger, equality in action and teaching compassion.

The fifth largest religion in the world, Sikhism has over 400,000 followers in Canada.

Despite celebrating Vaisakhi annually in Canada for many years in the traditional form of street parades, the holiday has not been celebrated in Victoria since 1912 and is expected to draw a crowd of thousands.

The parade will commence and end at 470 Cecelia Rd., travelling through Napier Lane, Burnside Road and Jutland Road, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. The festivities will run from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The Gurdwara will also donate to the Burnside Gorge Community Association, assisting them in their efforts to help families at risk of homelessness through the 'Homeless Family Outreach' program.

Corteo is the story of a clown who envisions his own funeral taking place in a carnival atmosphere, all while being watched over by angels. It is a show of juxtapositions, blending joy with sorrow, wisdom with comedy and the magic of

The musical show features performances like aerial acrobatics off of chandeliers, trampoline work off of 600-lb beds, and scenes with Cyr wheels, juggling, hula hoops and even an airborne dance involving helium balloons.

More than eight million people have already watched *Corteo* since it first premiered in Montreal in 2005. Since then it has toured in 64 cities across 19 countries spanning four continents.
