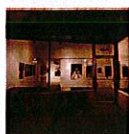

Project Grants

Project grants provide support for emerging or established arts organizations to produce or present one time, recurring, unique or developmental projects. Project grants are not available to organizations who receive operating assistance from the CRD.

The applicant must:

1. Be a non-profit society registered in BC and based in a participating Arts Service municipality or electoral area, as indicated by a physical mailing address;
2. Have programming in the arts as their primary mandate and purpose; and
3. Have been active in the region for six months.

Eligible expenses include but are not limited to:

- Support for artistic growth;
- Development of an art project;
- Production of an arts event, and;
- Dissemination of an artistic creation.

Grant amounts are determined by evidence of demonstrated need in the application, by the needs of other applications received at the same deadline, and by limits to available resources. Guidelines: www.crd.bc.ca/service/arts-funding

ELIGIBILITY Organizations must be registered not-for-profit societies located in a jurisdiction that participates in the Arts Development Service to be eligible.

Equity Grants

Equity Grants are to support arts initiatives by applicants from communities that are at-risk of exclusion or have difficulty accessing support for systemic reasons. Supported activities include, but are not limited to, support of artistic growth, development, production and dissemination.

The applicant must be either:

1. A non-profit society registered in BC from a self-identified community based in a participating Arts Development Service municipality or electoral area, as indicated by a physical mailing address, or;
2. An individual or group from a self-identified community who is not a society but who is leading a project and has found a society willing to act as, what we call, a Sponsor Society.

Eligible expenses include but are not limited to:

- Support for artistic growth;
- Development of an art project;
- Production of an arts event, and;
- Dissemination of an artistic creation.

ELIGIBILITY Organizations must be registered not-for-profit societies located in a jurisdiction that participates in the Arts Development Service to be eligible.

Incubator Grants

The CRD Incubator Grant program is intended to enhance sustainability and resiliency in the arts by funding short term staffing, mentoring, work-space, training or other resources that assist in the acceleration of organizational development or in the development of new arts projects.

In particular, the program is aimed at emerging organizations that are engaged in innovative, experimental or new artistic practices, and/or that have difficulty accessing startup funding or specialized expertise that will help to advance their practice.

The applicant must:

1. Be a non-profit society registered in BC and based in a participating Arts Service municipality or electoral area, as indicated by a physical mailing address, and;
2. Have programming in the arts as their primary mandate and purpose.

Eligible expenses include but are not limited to:

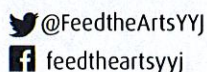
- Shared staff resources;
- Special training;
- Access to specific expertise such as mentoring;
- Access to workspace to develop an idea.
