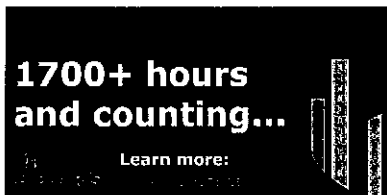

government profession in BC decade-by-decade over the past 100 years.

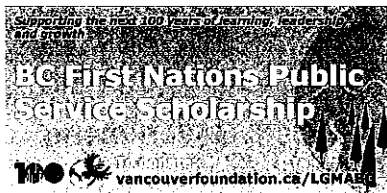
