

I hope this email finds you well and enjoying the first real glimpse of spring.

My email today is a bit urgent, and that is to see whether the City of Esquimalt might be willing to provide PPP with a letter of support as we seek funding for this September's One Wave Gathering.

We have a few major grants due at the end of next week and could really use this support. Thus I have taken the liberty of drafting a letter for you in case you are willing to help, and of course this draft can be changed however you see fit.

Essentially within this letter I have outlined parts of our recent discussion: that the City of Esquimalt is willing to provide support for the installation, signage and ceremonial proceedings of the House Post. What is new is PPP's goal to install the Pacific House Post this September 21 (the International Day of Peace) as the closing event of our 2019 One Wave Gathering program.
