Thank you for all your support. To confirm, we are happy to report that Bradley Dick (Songhees Nation) and Ake Lianga (Solomon Islander) are now contracted for the carving project tentatively called the Pacific House Post, they will jointly produce a contemporary House Post symbolic of the ocean that connects us and of the importance of peace & solidarity.

We are asking for in-kind support in the approximate value of \$2,500 from the city of Esquimalt. This would include the engineering / building of a cement pad along with fastenings and brace supports to install the expected 8 foot Pacific House Post, plus potentially, transportation of the artwork to the site along with project signage and your support with the dedication at the installation site, tentatively planned for September 21 (UN International Day of Peace) at Macaulay point.

To answer your questions about Macaulay point, I haven't been in touch with CRD about this project and didn't realize that they may have some jurisdiction over the site. I am just leaving for holidays and am back on April 15, at that time we will visit the proposed site and look into the CRD regulations. We are fortunate to also have good relations with CRD, so hope that they would work with us for this site as suggested by Songhees Nation.

In addition, if there was an opportunity for the city to make a modest contribution towards honorarium for key speakers and cultural presenters at the dedication ceremony in September we would be most appreciative, and if possible and required, chairs for elders at the site.

With regards to the letter of support, PPP is in the process of applying for funding with Canadian Heritage and with Gaming for the One Wave Gathering program that includes this house post project, having letters that generically (or specifically) outlines your support of our community building work via the One Wave Gathering is very helpful.

I will be monitoring my email only occasionally when I am away for holidays and am happy to have follow up conversations with you and Florence when I return mid-April.
