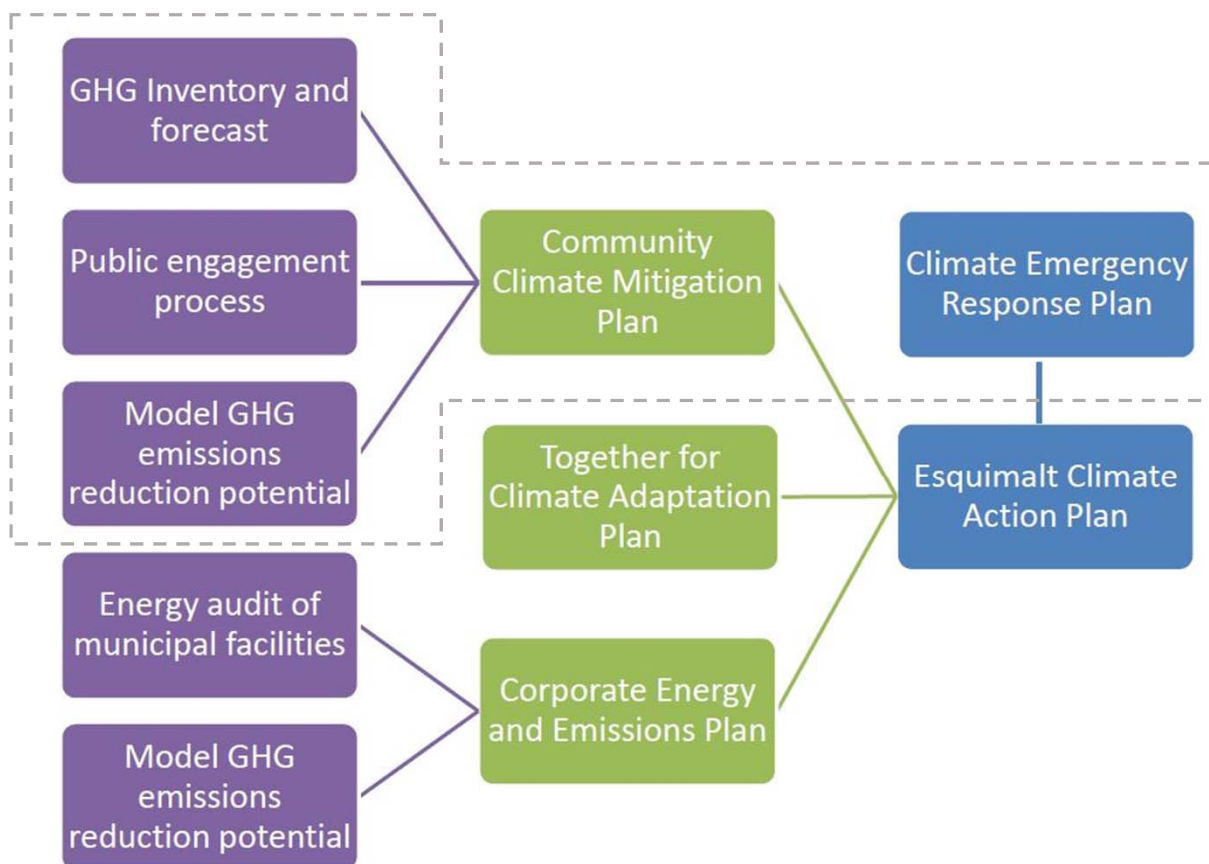

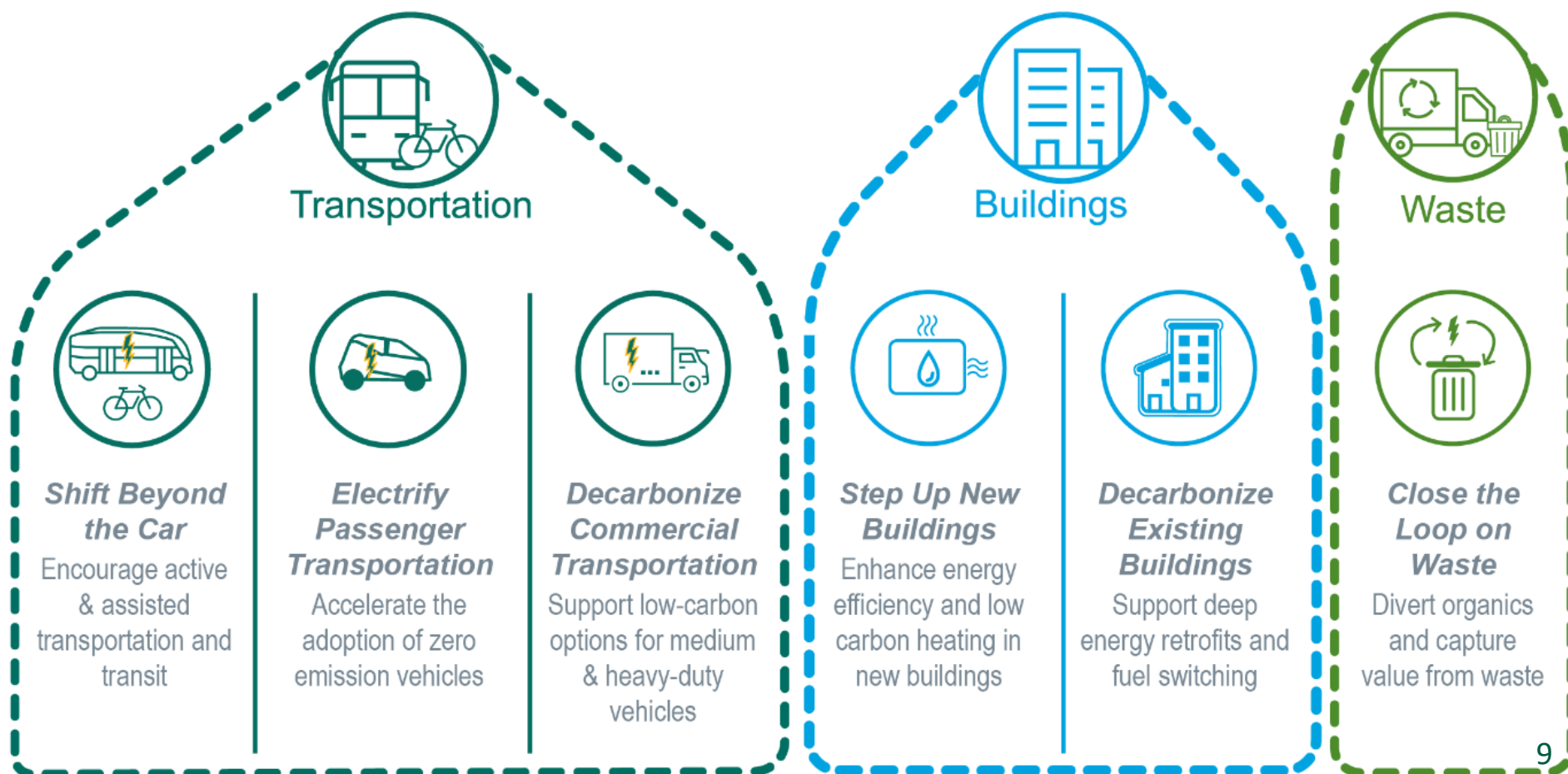

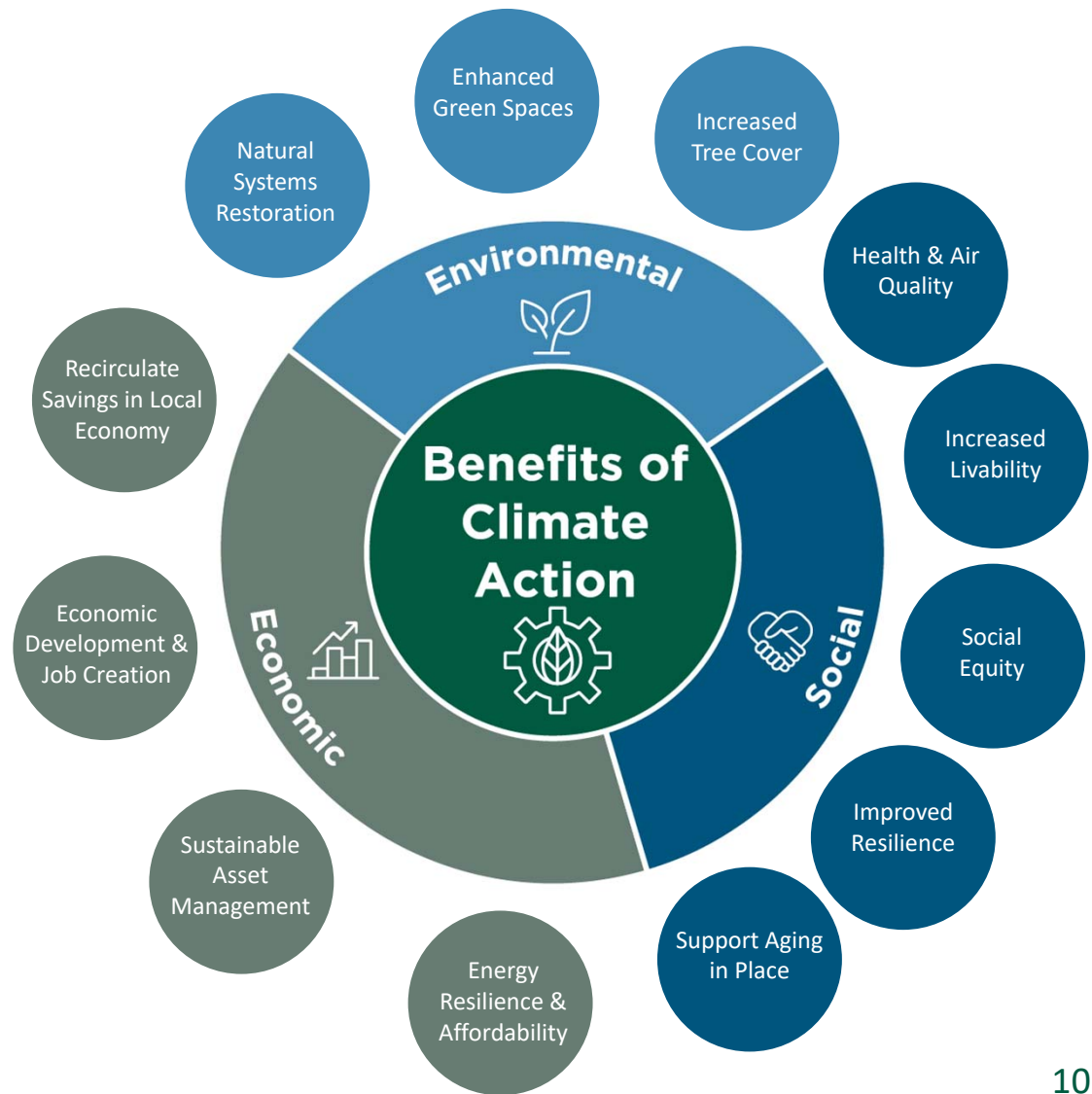

- Show leadership

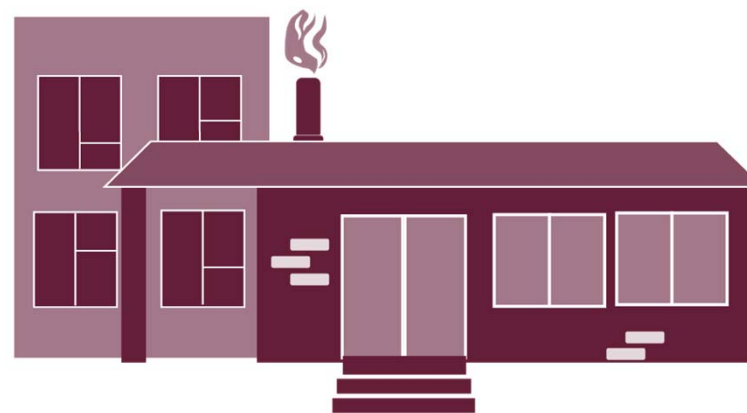
