Our mission is to create capacity in communities to promote safety and healthy relationships. Our vision is that all children are living, learning, and playing in safe and responsive								
	communities. ii) WPF is governed by a nine-person volunteer Board of Directors. We have three staff members (2.6 FTE) and over 20 volunteers. iii) Our pre-COVID hours of operation were Mon-Fri 8:30-4:30, however, due to people working and volunteering from home during COVID, occasionally there are exceptions to these hours/days.								

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4. PRINCIPAL USE OF THIS PROPERTY: Please provide a brief description of the principal use of the property and how this use benefits the community.

This property is the base of operations for WPF and its activities: the WITS group of bullying-prevention programs, and new this year, Pink Shirt Day activities. This property provides a central place for our team of volunteers and small staff to provide all our charitable programs and activities.

Recently, in response to COVID19, the use of this property enabled our team to research and develop the new "Home Activity Kit" for home learning. This summer we provided kits at no charge to local families in partnerships with the MFRC and the Esquimalt Neighbourhood House.

All our programs are offered free to families and schools in Esquimalt.

5. <u>PUBLIC ACCESS</u>: Please describe how your organization's services are available to the public. Is access to your organization's services limited in any way?

WPF primarily provides support to those involved with bullying-prevention safety strategies: schools, families, and program partners like police officers, firefighters, indigenous elders, and other local agencies. Our services are accessible to all without limitation.

6. <u>USAGE STATISTICS</u>: What percentage of your total client/member base are Esquimalt residents?

Thousands of Esquimalt children have experienced the WITS Programs. We deliver the WITS Programs and Pink Shirt Day activities throughout Canada, however our location allows us to place more focus on Esquimalt than any other area. Also, the WPF President David Valentine and Vice President Tom Woods both reside in Esquimalt, as do several of our volunteers.

7. <u>COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY</u>: Please provide a brief description of any commercial activities that your organization conducts on this property.

There are no sales of any goods from this property.

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8. <u>FUNDING</u>: Please provide details about any fees that are charged for your services. All our programs are offered free to families and schools in Esquimalt. For other schools, when we are unable to acquire subsidies, educational materials, training and inspirational speakers may have a cost. Pricing for educational materials can be found via the online store on our website (www.witsprogram.ca). Due to COVID19, fees for other services are under review.

Currently, we have acquired subsidies for schools in the Capital region and other select areas of BC. These include funds primarily from the Victoria Foundation, BC Community Gaming Grant, Vancouver Foundation, Shaw, and others.

We do not lease, rent or otherwise derive revenue by providing space to any third parties.

Notes to the Financial Statements March 31, 2019

Purpose of the Foundation

The Foundation was incorporated under the British Columbia Society Act on May 6, 1998 as a non-profit organization and is a registered charitable organization under the Income Tax Act. On November 3, 2016 the Foundation's name changed from Rock Solid Foundation to WITS Programs Foundation.

The Foundation was established to promote an atmosphere of non-violence in society through innovative programs and initiatives. A particular emphasis is placed on youth with targeted specific programs in the community.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

A summary of other significant accounting policies is presented below to assist the reader in evaluating the Foundation's financial statements:

(a) Revenue recognition

The Foundation follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

(b) Tangible capital assets and amortization

Tangible capital assets are recorded at cost and are being amortized over their estimated useful lives using the declining balance method at the following rates:

Furniture and equipment - 20% Computer hardware - 55%

(c) Contributed services

Volunteers and other organizations have contributed significant time and resources to assist the Foundation in carrying out it's programs and activities. Because of the difficulty of determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

2. Inventory

Inventory consists of books, school supplies, and resources to be sold to the members of the Foundation. The Foundation measures its inventory at the lower of cost and current replacement value.
