The Director of Financial Services advised the Committee's recommendations with respect to the permissive tax exemption applications would proceed to Council on October 4, 2021 by way of a bylaw for consideration.

Committee discussion included:

* Employing the same approach as the previous year; no new applications and sustaining prior funding levels;

* Including a recommendation for number of years for the exemptions; and

* Considering other sources of financial support provided to the organizations.

Moved by Councillor Vermeulen, seconded by Councillor Helliwell: That the Local Grant Committee recommends to Council approval of the following permissive tax exemptions:

75% exemption for 2022 and 2023 for the Boys and Girls Club of Victoria and the Compassionate Resource Warehouse;

25% exemption for 2022 and 2023 for Island Community Health dba McCauley, Victoria Association for Community Living, and VOS Musical Theatre; and

25% exemption for 2022 for the Mustard Seed Street Church. Carried Unanimously
