Moved by Councillor Liberchuk, seconded by Councillor Morrison: That Council resolves that Heritage Alteration Permit No. HAP00002 [Appendix A] that varies the provisions of Heritage Designation [429 Lampson Street] Bylaw, 2013, No. 2807, allowing the alterations and additions to the heritage building in accordance with the architectural drawings prepared by Merrick Architecture stamped 'Received September 18, 2017', attached to Heritage Alteration Permit No. HAP00002 as Schedule 'A', and including the following variance, be approved, and staff be directed to issue the permit and register the notice on the title of the property located at PID 023-009-331, Lot B, Esquimalt District, Plan VIP60066 [429 Lampson Street]:

Zoning Bylaw 1992, No. 2050, Section 67.71 B. Site A (7)(a) Siting Requirements - Principal Building - A variance to the permitted perimeter of the principal building as shown on the Land Surveyor's Certificate, McElhanney Consulting prepared by Services, stamped 'Received September 9, 2013', to allow the addition of a 'new main level terrace and exterior grand stair', a 'new lower level infill below an existing upper level addition' at the east side of the building and the removal of two exterior 'existing stairs and doors' at the front (west side) of the building, as detailed on Schedule 'A' [the Site Plan - Sheet A1.61] prepared by Merrick Architecture and stamped 'Received September 18, 2017'. Carried Unanimously.

8) <u>17-404</u> Request from Hidden Harbour Marina for letter of support to Transport Canada re Captain Jacobson's Park, Staff Report DEV-17-056

Director of Development Services advised Council of an amendment to the staff recommendation.

Moved by Councillor Low, seconded by Councillor Brame: That Council authorize the Chief Administrative Officer or her designate to send a letter to the Superintendent of Property Services for Transport Canada on behalf of the Corporation of the Township of Esquimalt (the Township) stating that Council consents to the impairment of the Township's riparian rights adjacent to Captain Jacobson's Park subject to:

- The Township retaining the right to repair, maintain, replace, and relocate the storm water pipe and outfall located in Captain Jacobson's Park;

- The Township retaining the right to repair, maintain, or otherwise modify the shore of Captain Jacobson's Park, subject to receiving all necessary approvals, to enhance safety or the ecological integrity of the shore line; and

- Nothing in the renewed lease preventing emergency responders from accessing the riparian area in emergency situations (e.g. to pump water for fire fighting or desalination).

- Unobstructed access at all times for the purpose of deploying, redeploying, and recovering equipment, materials, and appurtenances required to control, recover, or prevent pollutants that may or have entered West Bay through the storm water outfall. Carried Unanimously.

"That Council resolves that Development Permit No. DP000094 [Appendix A] authorizing the development as illustrated on the architectural drawings and the landscape plan prepared by Zebra Design, stamped "Received September 5, 2017", and sited as detailed on the survey plan prepared by Island Land Surveying, stamped "Received July 28, 2017" be approved, and staff be directed to issue the permit (subject to receipt of the required landscape security), and register the notice on the title of the property located at PID 008-400-571, Lot 17, Suburban Lot 30, Esquimalt District, Plan 772A [468 Foster Street].

Furthermore, that Council resolves that Development Variance Permit No. DVP00069 [Appendix B] authorizing the development as illustrated on the architectural drawings prepared by Zebra Design, stamped "Received September 5, 2017", and sited as detailed on the survey plan prepared by Island Land Surveying, stamped "Received July 28, 2017", and including the following variances to Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050, be approved, and staff be directed to issue the permit and register the notice on the title of the property located at PID 008-400-571, Lot 17, Suburban Lot 30,

Esquimalt District, Plan 772A [468 Foster Street]:

Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050, Section 40 (6)(a) - Building Height - Principal Building: A 0.78 metre increase to the requirement that no principal building shall exceed a height of 7.3 metres [ie. from 7.3 metres to 8.08 metres].

Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050, Section 40 (8.1) - Building Massing - Principal Building: A 6.4% increase to the requirement that the second storey of any Two Family Dwelling shall be a maximum of 75% of the total floor area of the ground floor, including an attached garage [ie. from 75% to 81.4%]." Defeated.
