Anderson and Associates Surveyors Engineers, stamped "Received June 21, 2019", be approved, and staff be directed to issue the Permit (subject to receipt of the required landscape security) and register the notice on the titles of the property located at 638 Constance Avenue [PID 030-878-420, Lot 1, Suburban Lot 44, Esquimalt District, Plan EPP93555].
