3. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Moved by Councillor Hundleby, seconded by Councillor Helliwell: That the agenda be approved as circulated with the inclusion of the late items. Carried Unanimously.

4. PUBLIC INPUT ON ANY ITEMS LISTED ON THE AGENDA

Eric Rotgans, *resident*, who cycles throughout Esquimalt, spoke in favour of the building out of cycling infrastructure and commented that it must be done in less than five years as ten to fifteen years to complete is too long. In addition, Lyall Street should be addressed to help get more people on bicycles and make walking improvements to the town centre.

Kym Thrift, *resident*, recommened Council adopt the Active Transportation Network Plan with shorter timelines and committed budget. Additional recommendations included building Tillicum Road, Lampson Street and Esquimalt Road to true all ages and abilities standards by the end of 2024 and all short term actions within the Plan be completed by 2025.

5. STAFF REPORTS

Administration

1) 22-064 Policy Amendments Implement Notice of to Recommendation Process for Environmental and Parks Report No. Recreation Advisory Committees, Staff and ADM-22-002

The CAO and Corporate Officer responded to questions from Council. Council comments included consideration be given to accelerated timelines to deal with time-sensitive matters, potential to increase frequency of meetings while recognizing staff workload, and requested to receive any feedback from committees regarding timelines.
